APTA Indiana is seeking proposal submissions for the 2024 APTA Indiana Fall Conference, scheduled for November 9, 2024, at the University of Indianapolis.

Proposals for 1.5- and 3-hour educational sessions are now being accepted. We will have two tracks: a professional track and a student track. Please specify if you are submitting for the professional track or the student track.

The theme for this year's conference is "Innovation." The conference will focus on how we, as current and incoming professionals, can use innovation to strengthen the connection between evidence and practice.

Proposal Submission Deadline - April 15, 2024

Proposal Submission Information:

Proposal submissions for educational sessions must contain the following:

- 1. Title (15 words maximum)
- 2. Track Designation: Professional or Student
- 3. Session Description (250 words maximum)
- 4. Session Learning Objectives (four maximum)
- 5. Minimum of 5-7 Current Bibliographic References (no more than 7 years old at the time of the Fall Conference presentation)
- 6. Timed Outline of Content that Aligns with Learning Objectives
- 7. Speaker Information
 - Name, Degrees/Credentials
 - Institution, City, State
 - Speaking Experience for Each Speaker
 - CV for Each Speaker
 - Brief Speaker Bio for Each Speaker for Marketing/Introduction

Important Things to Remember When Submitting Your Proposal:

- 1. Speaker information will appear exactly as submitted in all publications, both in print and online. Please ensure the accuracy of this information before finalizing your submission.
- 2. Please indicate if your proposal is for a 1.5-hour or 3-hour educational session. Please specify if you are submitting for the professional track or the student track.
- 3. If your session requires space or technology other than the traditional classroom (tables/chairs) setting, please include this information in your proposal.
- 4. Selection of proposals will be based on the foundation in evidence, clarity of proposal, probable interest to participants, fiscal feasibility, location of speakers, and space and time constraints.
- 5. Proposals should reflect cultural and/or ethical components related to clinical practice and research as related to session content.
- 6. Proposals should be devoid of any promotional content.
